Re: Case No. 9318 – Application of Dominion Cove Point LNG, LP for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity

Dear Executive Secretary Collins,

Pursuant to Condition G-1 of Order No. 86372, Dominion Cove Point LNG, LP (“DCP”) is required to file with the Maryland Public Service Commission (“Commission”): (i) a State Fire Marshal Report; (ii) an Emergency Response Plan; and (iii) an executed Cost Sharing Plan with State and local agencies affected by DCP’s project in Case No. 9318. Additionally, if a determination is made through consultation with affected responding agencies that an additional off-site emergency plan is not needed at this time, Order No. 86372 requires DCP to set forth the basis for such a determination.

DCP filed the State Fire Marshal Report with the Commission on June 25, 2014. With this filing, DCP submits the remaining items requested by the Commission pursuant to Condition G-1, as follows:

Attachment 1 - Emergency Response Plan (Operations) and Construction Emergency Response Plan (collectively the “ERP”). As required by Order No. 86372, the attached ERP responds to the findings by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) in its Environmental Assessment for DCP’s Liquefaction Project issued in FERC Docket No. CP13-113. The ERP also addresses site safety and emergency response coverage during the construction and operation periods of the project, as required by the Commission’s order.

Attachment 2 – Off-Site Emergency Consultation Letter. The attached letter reflects DCP’s consultation regarding the need for an off-site emergency plan, and the basis upon which it has been determined that an additional plan is not needed at this time.

Attachment 3 – Cost Sharing Plan. As required by Condition G-1, the plan includes executed letter agreements governing reimbursement of costs incurred by all affected state and local responding agencies.

The ERP is designated as “Critical Energy Infrastructure Information” (“CEII”) and is therefore protected under FERC regulations. Accordingly, DCP is submitting the ERP in hard copy only, and will provide an original and ten (10) copies marked as CONFIDENTIAL pursuant to instructions from your office. The Off-Site Emergency Consultation Letter and Cost Sharing Plan have been marked PUBLIC. Accordingly, DCP hereby submits for filing an original and seventeen (17) copies and has included Attachments 2 and 3, along with this transmittal letter, in its e-filing with the Commission.

I have enclosed an extra copy of the PUBLIC and CONFIDENTIAL versions of the filing, and request that these be date-stamped and returned in the enclosed self-addressed envelope. Should you have any questions, please contact me.

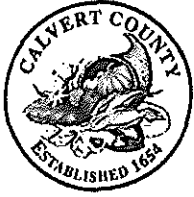

COST SHARING AGREEMENTS

I. Calvert County Office of the County Administrator

The Calvert County Office of the County Administrator has confirmed its continued commitment to work with DCP on all emergency planning, security and emergency response matters related to DCP's facilities. As more specifically explained in the attached cost sharing agreement dated June 26, 2014, which is attached hereto, DCP has committed to fund, in addition to past funding amounts, costs that would flow through the County, such as costs for the Calvert County Fire and Rescue Association and Maryland Emergency Management Agency. DCP has also committed to fund additional training and capital costs.

II. Calvert County Fire and Rescue Association

The Calvert County Fire and Rescue Association has confirmed to DCP that it has the capability to respond to a call for service in connection with an emergency at DCP's facilities, including providing command and control of fire response, emergency medical services, and hazardous materials response. DCP has committed to reimbursing costs incurred in connection with such support. The cost sharing arrangement with the Calvert County Fire and Rescue Association is set forth in the executed cost sharing agreement with the Calvert County Office of the County Administrator, attached hereto.

III. Office of the Sheriff of Calvert County

The Office of the Sheriff of Calvert County has confirmed to DCP that it has the capability to respond to a call for service in connection with an emergency at DCP's facilities. DCP has committed to reimbursing costs incurred in connection with such support pursuant to a post-event analysis that would be conducted by the Calvert County Sheriff's Office. The executed cost sharing agreement dated June 24, 2014 is attached hereto.

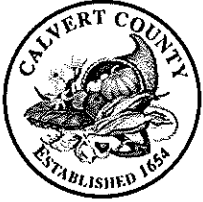
IV. Maryland Department of State Police

The Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC) recently issued Order No. 86372 for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) for the proposed Dominion Cove Point expansion. Within that Order the PSC has requested that Dominion Cove Point submit a cost-sharing plan that identifies the mechanism for funding all project-specific security/emergency management costs that would be imposed on state and local agencies. In addition to the funding of these costs, the PSC also requested that the plan include funding mechanisms for capital costs associated with any security/emergency management equipment and personnel.

This correspondence confirms the existing Dominion Cove Point and the Calvert County Maryland, Board of County Commissioners' relationship for emergency planning and security. As you know, we have already entered into a cost-sharing relationship to provide security. In fact, Dominion Cove Point provides 100 percent of the funding for security and reimburses the County for any and all related costs incurred by the Calvert County Sheriff's Office. It is also our understanding that costs over and above direct transit-related costs for the Calvert County Fire and Rescue Association, and any new equipment and training needs identified that are directly related to the Dominion project, will be covered by Dominion. The County has responsibility for emergency management but if the County incurred any costs as a result of the County seeking assistance from the Maryland Emergency Management Agency, the County would bill Dominion for those related costs. As part of this funding, Dominion covers a variety of expenses to include capital equipment, dedicated personnel and related personnel costs, in addition to other supplies required to support the security funding. In FY 2014, Dominion provided approximately \$1.2 million to the Calvert County Sheriff's Office.

It is our understanding that, in accordance with the existing cost-sharing plan, Dominion will continue to provide funding, as needed, for capital equipment as it relates to emergency response. While Dominion does not pay direct transit-related costs incurred by emergency response agencies in relation to LNG Terminal operations, Dominion does make substantial contributions for specialized training of emergency response personnel. We are comfortable with this approach moving forward and appreciate Dominion's ongoing commitment to pay for training of emergency response personnel. We appreciate your recent commitment to train up to 21 additional personnel through 2017 and cover any related travel expenses. As additional training needs are identified by Dominion in cooperation with Calvert County emergency planners, it is our understanding that Dominion will fund that training as well as any costs to annually recertify to maintain certifications.



This signed Letter of Agreement between the Calvert County Fire & Rescue Association (the Association) and Dominion Cove Point LNG (DCP) confirms support of the DCP Emergency Response Plan. The Association, using the National Incident Management System will respond to emergency incidents, including a hostile action based event, upon notification by DCP in accordance with the established communications protocol. The Association agrees to provide command and control of fire department operations, emergency medical services (including transport of sick and/or injured), fire suppression response, fire apparatus, hazardous materials response, technical rescue response and volunteer fireman as requested by DCP including the ability to activate mutual aid agreements if additional resources are needed.

This Agreement will be automatically renewed for periods of one year, commencing two (2) years from the date of execution of this Agreement unless any party gives written notice of termination to the other Party at least six months prior to the expiration of the original term or the then current renewal term of its intention not to renew the Agreement.

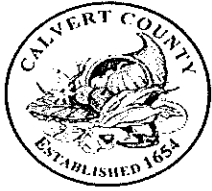

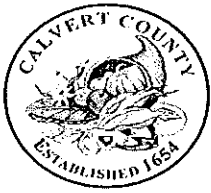
